In addition, the following offences have been added to Section 327 of the Criminal Justice Act 2003 by the Deregulation Act 2015.

Although they are not specified in Schedule 15 they qualify offenders for MAPPA in the same way that Schedule 15 offences do (*they require 12 months custody and will come into category 2*).

Supplementary Guidance – Burglary

To qualify as a MAPPA Category 2 offender, you must have a conviction for **Section 9, 1(a) only and also the element must be with the intent to inflict GBH or to commit unlawful damage therein.**

If the conviction under Section 9, 1a) is the theft element, then they do not qualify.
